INFORMATION.

1. Every year from 1st April to 15th June, and again from 1st October to fist January, there is a possibility of cyclones forming in the Bay of Rengal, North of the Andaman Islands and moving in to the Arakan Coast.

2. The absence of reports from shipping results in reports from aircraft being the only source of supply of meteerological information from the Bay of Bengal.

Since the cyclones are very destructive, it is imperative that Air Forces operating over the Araban shall have the maximum warning of their approach.

INTENTION.

To provide daily meteorological reconnaissance of the Bay of Bongal during the remainder of the current cyclonic season, namely until 15th June 1944 (incl.)

Until 15th June (incl.) mirroraft on Maxim patrols are to return direct to Base after reaching the Southernmost point of the patrol; instead of carrying the return leg to the North.

6. Pending receipt of the necessary amendments to E.A.C.; Operational Directive No. 3 by Air Commander, Eastern Air Command, Maxim patrels are to be flown as at present using the Northernmost point of entry only.
