MENTIONED IN DESPATCHES.

TWO LOCAL OFFICERS.

Two local officers were mentioned in General French's last despatches. They are Brigadier-General Briggs, son of the late Col. Briggs, of Hylton Castle, and Lieut. Boyd, son of the late Mr Robert Boyd, of Houghton-le-Spring, and Moorhill, Leamside.

Brigadier-General Briggs entered the Army in the 5th Dragoons, and distinguished himself as a cavalry leader in the Boer War. He has since been specially commended for his ability in the different autumn manoeuvres, especially those round Cambridge. He is generally regarded as one of the most promising cavalry leaders in the Army, and his mention by General French adds fresh laurels to his name. A nephew of the late Mr Robert Scott Briggs, who was for many years chairman of the River Wear Commission, Brigadier-General Briggs belongs to one of the oldest and most respected families in the district.

Lieut. Boyd, of the Northumberland Fusiliers, has also been mentioned, but unfortunately the gallant officer has died of his wounds. He was a son of the late Mr Robert Boyd, of Houghton-le-Spring, and the nephew of the late Mr George Fenwick Boyd, who was High Sheriff of the county. He distinguished himself at football at his father's old school, Rugby, where he obtained his colours, an honour which he also achieved at the 'Varsity. The older residents in the town will remember his father, who was long a member of the old Sunderland Rugby Football Club. Lieut. Boyd, who was an only son, and leaves a widowed mother, had a promising career in the Army, and his loss will be widely mourned, his family being well known and respected throughout the district.
