

### THE LATE CORPORAL R. N. WHITE.

News has been received that Corporal Roy N. White, youngest son of F. and W. H. White, Glenelg, was killed in action in France on August 22. He enlisted in August, 1914, and left Australia in October of the same year. He took part in the landing at Gallipoli, where he was wounded, and after four months in England returned, and was on the peninsula until the

evacuation. He was wounded again in France. At the time of enlisting he was employed in the offices of the S.A. Railway. He played for the Holdfast Bay Lacrosse Club. For many years he was a chorister at St. Peter's Church, Glenelg. He was 26 years of age.



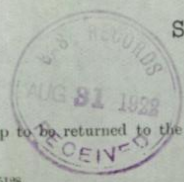
