

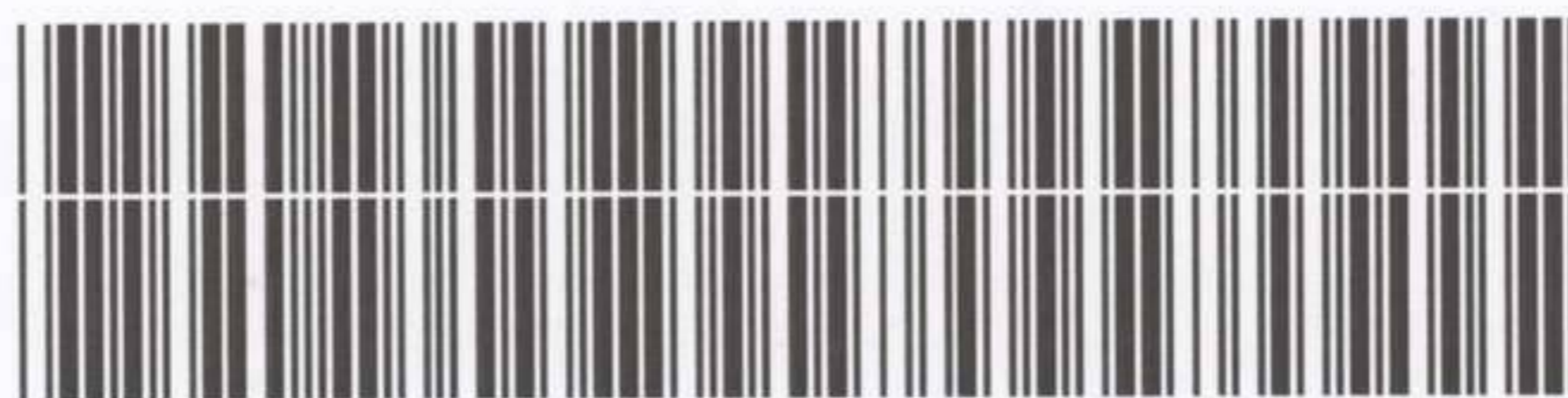

BLARINGHEM.	SEPT. 1.		From 1 st to 7 th Sept Training was carried on as usual in the BLARINGHEM area at This included a scheme to test the HQ & Coy signallers and a battalion outpost scheme. On 7 th inst orders were received for Bn to move by motor bus to WIPPENHOEK area on the 8 th . This was duly carried out & Bn moved to OTTAWA CAMP near OUDERDOM on that date.	see Training Programme. Bn Order 24
OUDERDOM	Sept 9		'D' were ordered on 9 th to go under orders of 1 st ANZAC Heavy Artillery for construction of Gun Positions. The company was very much split up; small parties being attached to the various batteries & groups.	
DICKERBUSCH	Sept 10 Sept 11		Orders received & Bn moved by march route to PIONEER CAMP. Sheet 28.H.21 b.3.g. Bn under orders of C.R.E Corps Troops & started work on forward roads - the work assigned being construction of a road from Bir Cross Roads to ZILLEBEKE. This had to be partially planked with beech slabs & partially metalled. The chief difficulties were getting material up as the batteries were mainly just off this road & drew a considerable amount of heavy shell fire - also our dumps & cross roads were periodically shelled making it impossible to get the transport up. This road was worked at consistently till night of 19 th /20 th when it was completed. Parties were also detailed loading timber at DICKERBUSCH for this work. Sand Road was often blown up & had to be remade so progress was slow & on nights of 17/18 & 18/19 shelling was so severe as to make work extremely difficult & very little could be done. Road was named LEINSTER ROAD. We had 3 men killed & one officer & 17 men wounded on this work.	Bn Order 25 See map attached.
	Sept 19		Portion of 'D' Coy were detailed for work under Corps Water Supply in laying of pipe line - 50 men of 'C' Coy were further detailed to assist Corp Heavy Artillery in constructing forward positions. a double duckwalk track was laid by C Coy near Half Way House (600 yards long). an earth track was completed joining centres of GORDON & LEINSTER roads	chief Engineer's Dept No 45

DICKEBUSH	1917 Sept 19		A Coy were detailed to construct an artillery road N of CHATEAU WOOD - very little notice was given & work had to be reconnoitred & completed that night. A Coy carried it thro' altho they were heavily shelled at the time and darkness was intense. We are getting all our men to aid from work in Motor Lorries - this enables us to get far more value from their work & better work done. Our camp site is about 6 miles from front line.	
	Sept 20		1 st & 2 nd Divs attacked at dawn capturing both objectives. Our work was the maintenance of a road circuit which did not prove difficult as after 11 am shelling in rear areas ceased almost entirely for rest of day. We had an Adv. HQ near GORDON HOUSE with a visual station back to SWAN CHATEAU. Cyclist from there to PIONEER CAMP. All parties were withdrawn at 5 pm.	CRE Coy's Instr No 1
	Sept 21		We got urgent message at 11 pm last night that the diversion from MENIN Road near HOOGE known as KANGWAN TRACK was impassable for guns that required to be blown up. 3 coys went out to make this into a plank road at 3 am. Work was practically complete when we knocked off at 12 noon - an Aust ⁿ tunnelling Coy carried on the work from us. B Coy were detailed to control transport bringing stuff up to HOOGE & we got something like 8000 slabs up.	Messages attached.
	Sept 22		Lt. WARDROP reported for help from training battalion. We came under orders of CRE. 5 th Aust Div as our Divs are moving into the line. 'B' Coy started continuing a Decauville track near HOOGE & A & C Coys resumed started work on a road from CHATEAU to GLENCORSE woods.	Chief Engr Instr No 46
	Sept 23		Parties from Heavy Artillery & Water supply rejoined Battalion which is now complete.	5 th Div Engr Instr No 28/75/7

	25		Shelling around HOOGE & MENIN ROAD very heavy - interfered with work considerably.	
	26		Road thro' to GLENCORSE WOOD by 4 am - fit for motor traffic up to J.7.d.q.1. for horse traffic beyond. 5 th Div attacked this morning at daybreak - both objectives captured by night fall.

1. Reference to Engineer Instruction No. 43 dated 16th. September 1917, the program of work laid down for C.R.E. Corps Troops, 1st. Anzac in Para.3 of Part 2 will be altered as follows:

42nd A.T. Coy. With assistance of 8th and 123rd Labour Company's will be responsible for the maintenance during operations of :-

- (a) Road from ZILLEBEKE VILLAGE TO SHRAPNEL CORNER.
- (b) WARRINGTON ROAD, from LILLE ROAD TO ZILLEBEKE-HELL FIRE CORNER ROAD. I.16.d.6.5.
- (c) Road from LILLE GATE TO WHITE CHATEAU.
- (d) DUCKWALK WHITE CHATEAU I.15.a.9.8. to GORDON HOUSE.

Patrols will be continually on these roads.

Sections from 42nd A.T. Company and 8th and 123rd Labour Companies will be maintained in readiness near SWAN CHATEAU. I.11.c. central and parties moved up immediately on receipt of notification of damage to roads.

Small dumps of stone have been placed at intervals along the roads.

Beech slabs are to be placed at intervals along the plank roads.

Dumps to be marked by a cross.

42nd A.T. Coy's transport to be held ready to assist.

5th AUSTRALIAN PIONEER BATTALION. Will be responsible for the maintenance during operations of :-

- (a) Road from HELL FIRE CORNER TO BIRR X ROADS.
- (b) Road from ZILLEBEKE TO BIRR X ROADS. LEINSTER ROAD.
- (c) ROAD FROM ZILLEBEKE TO HELL FIRE CORNER. GORDON ROAD.
- (d) MULE TRACK FROM WARRINGTON ROAD TO WALEWAY HOUSE.
- (e) DUCKWALK FROM GORDON HOUSE TO LEINSTER FARM. PIONEER TRACK.

Patrols will be continually on these roads.

An advanced Battalion station will be maintained at ZILLEBEKE. One Company to be detailed for each section of roads and one platoon from each company to be always in readiness at CANAL at DERBY ROAD CROSSING to proceed to repair damages in its section on receiving notification from ZILLEBEKE advanced post.

Battalion transport to be used if required and held in readiness.

Stone dumps have been made at intervals and beech slabs are to be placed along plank roads. Such dumps to be marked by a cross.

235th. A.T. Coy. Will be responsible for the maintenance of all bridges over YPRES CANAL in Corps Area.

Patrols will continually visit the bridges during operations. A section of sappers under an Officer will be held in readiness near BRIDGE 13 with tools to execute any immediate repairs.

EMERGENCY ROAD REPORT.

On the evening of the day prior to the day of attack 1st A.A. Sub Park will be placed at the disposal of the Chief Engineer for hasty repairs of metalled roads in the forward area.

x These lorries will each carry ~~xx~~ a red flag by which they can be distinguished by the traffic control personnel. The latter will be instructed by the A.P.M. to give right of way and direction over all other traffic.

Lorries will be organised in pairs, each pair having a crew of eight men who will be detailed by the C.E. from A.T. Coys at his disposal.

Pairs of lorries will be stationed in groups at points to be selected by the C.E. and will be loaded as follows:

One lorry of each pair.) One half stone in sandbags.
(one half soling.

The second lorry of each pair (one half stone.
(one half gravel.

The A.P.M. will arrange that the mounted personnel ~~ix~~ of the traffic control are informed as to where the lorries are parked and for the system of intercommunication.

As instructed I beg to submit hereunder a scheme for the delivery of stone on the Forward Area Roads before and during operations.

1. Each day (or night) two hundred tons of stone be dumped in Lorry Roads at a distance of 100 yards apart (or if time permits 50 yards apart) on the roads forward of SHRAPNEL CORNER and passing Zellebeke-Hell Fire Corner, Birr X Roads, and as far as the entrance to Hooge.
2. Special dumps be made of about 20 tons at Sheet 28 I.22.b.8.4. and I.17.b.3.6. and if possible at Hooge and at intervals of 1000 yards between Shrapnel Corner and Zillebeke.
3. During operations the full park to stand loaded with stone ~~in~~ the position between H.18.d.0.0. and H.18.d.10.6. The Headquarters of this unit will be established at this point which is nearer the office and telephone of the C.R.E. Ist. Aust. Division.

There are Brigade Signal Exchanges at I.17.c.3.7. (Halfway House) and I.17.b.2.8. (Birr X Roads) and connection can be made from these points with the office of the C.R.E. Ist Aust Division. On receipt of telephonic communication lorries can be despatched at the shortest notice to any position needing repairs. On return the lorries will be reloaded and return to their Headquarters awaiting a further call.

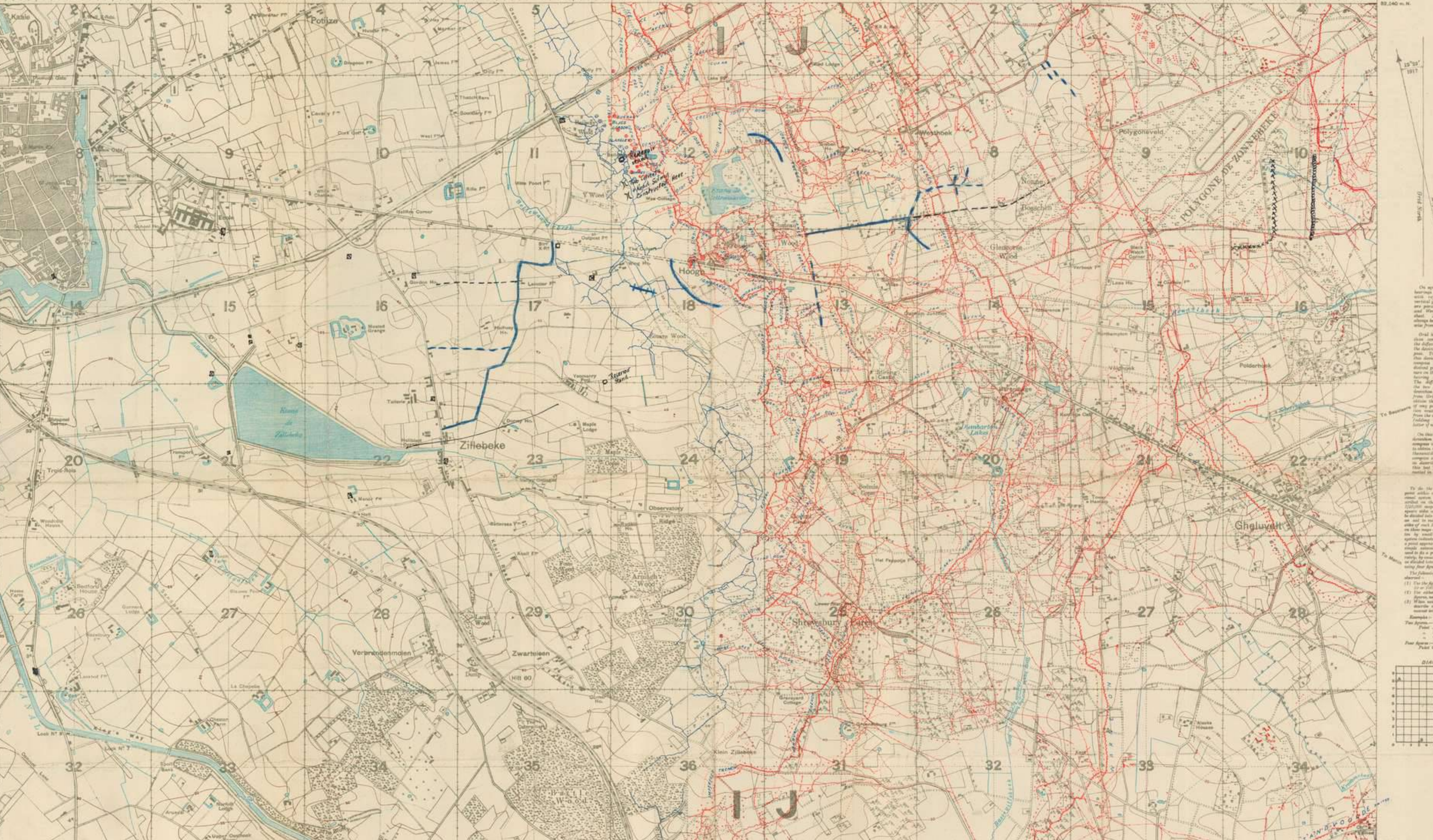

To find out what the direction is, take a bearing starting in a known direction, and measure on the map the true bearing of that direction. The difference between the two bearings is the direction of the square. To obtain the true bearing of any point, take a bearing from the square bearing (bearing 500) to the point (bearing 500).

To do the position of a point on a square, a square bearing is 17° 52' and to obtain the true bearing of a point, take a bearing from the square bearing (bearing 500) to the point (bearing 500).
